
WEEK IN REVIEW



During the first week at Game Arena, the youth participated in icebreakers and teambuilding activities to get to know one another better. They explored various roles and jobs within the esports industry and discovered that they could earn full-ride college scholarships just for playing video games. After learning about these roles, they were informed that by the end of the program, they would be organizing their own Rocket League tournament, complete with players, coaches, production, and a live stream. The youth also had hands-on gaming experience, playing Rocket League to learn the basics, which resulted in the youth participating in a tournament on Friday, where Jevlani Abdi emerged as the winner.



While learning about competitive Rocket League, youth learned about moves like aerials, dribbling, and wall shots throughout the week in preparation for a major tournament on Friday. Each day was dedicated to perfecting these techniques, mastering the art of aerial maneuvers to swiftly intercept and redirect the ball mid-air, honing dribbling skills to maintain control under pressure, and practicing wall shots for precision strikes from unexpected angles. These practice sessions showed the youth what players and coaches do every day for 8-12 hours. Strategies. 


