## WEEK IN REVIEW



This week, students started learning visual inspections and how to do one. They've also learned how to search for car parts when working on a car work order. They worked on knowing the parts of cars for a friendly competition that will take place between Lead The Way students and Performance Automotive's summer program class. They were able to work on one of the student's car, performing an inspection first, then mounting the car. They then worked on the brakes and calipers of the car.



Students worked on inspecting cars in the shop and learning how to dismount and mount tires. They each had an opportunity to apply the knowledge they learned in real-time work. They were able to use the various tools and machines, and also worked on learning how to take covers off of seats. This included taking apart some of the electrical aspects under the seats, then building it back up again.

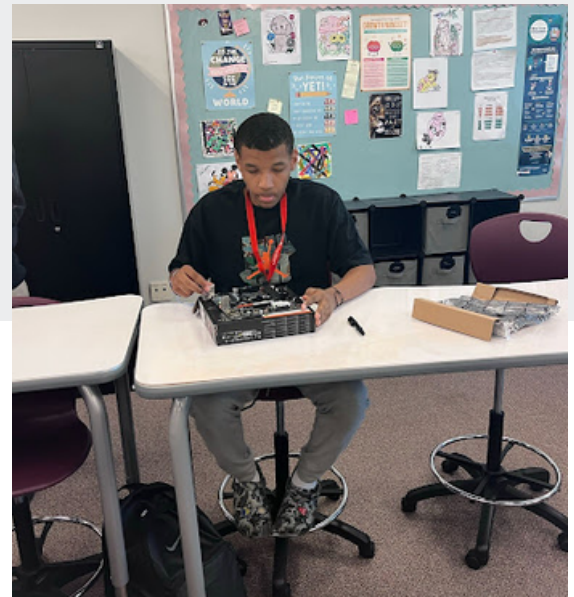
# INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

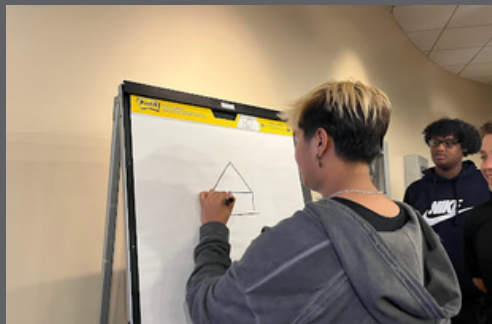
