


Event Planning



Experienced mentors impart practical skills such as safety protocols, fabrication, welding, mechanics, and assembly in a practical learning environment. Our hands-on, collaborative approach not only boosts confidence and community spirit but also exposes young participants to diverse career opportunities. Beginning in July, they will be introduced to the fundamentals of go-kart engines, wheels, steering, brakes, and competition. They will engage in hands-on disassembly and assembly exercises, culminating in a visit to compete on a karting race track.


WEEK IN REVIEW
