



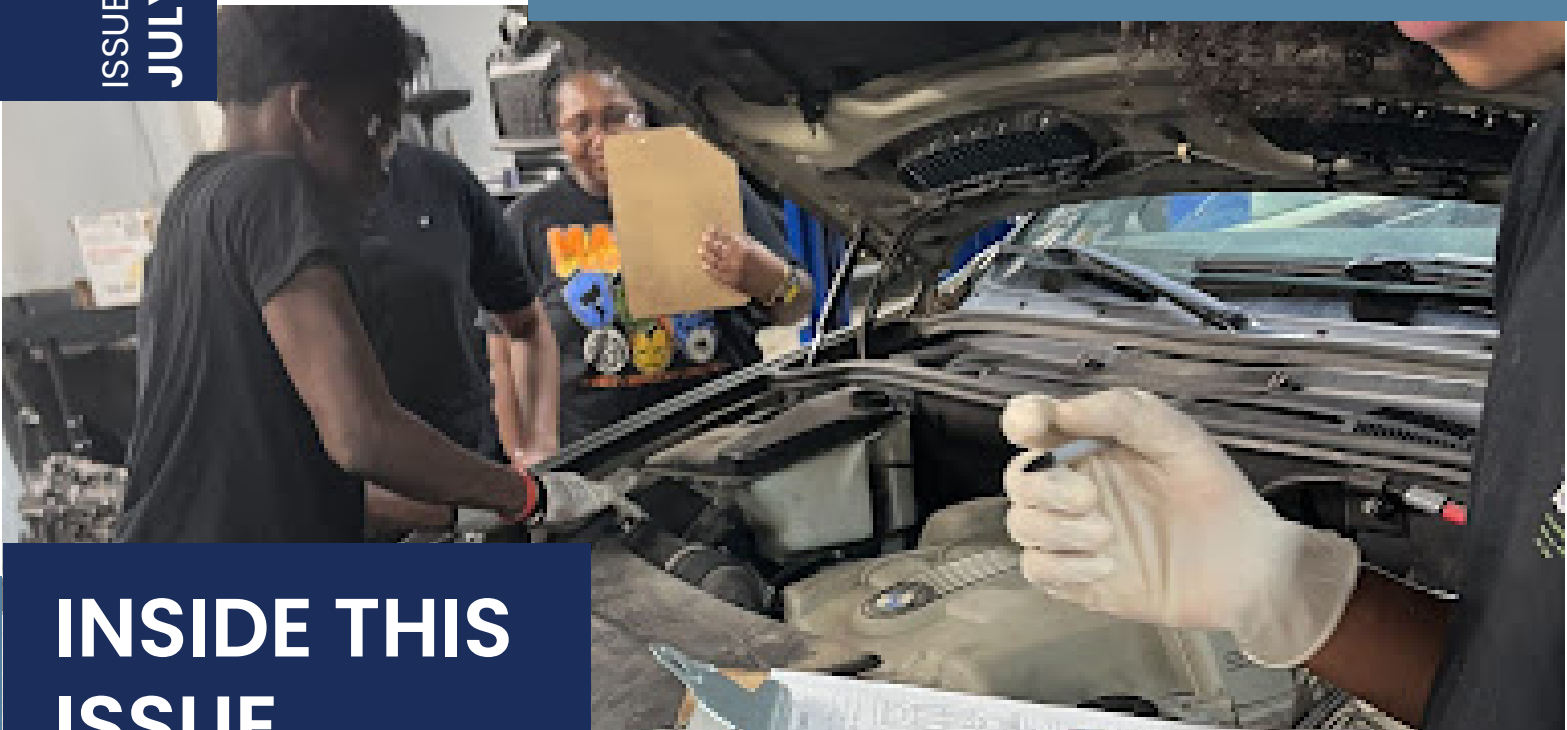

The young men have taken several practice tests to prepare them for their testing on July 25th and July 31, 2024. This week, they were able to take a practice test of the actual COMP TIA exam.

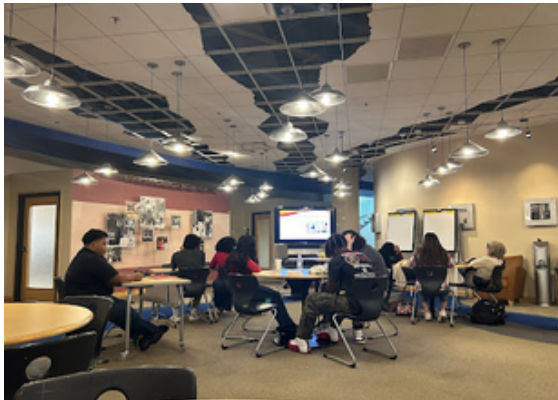

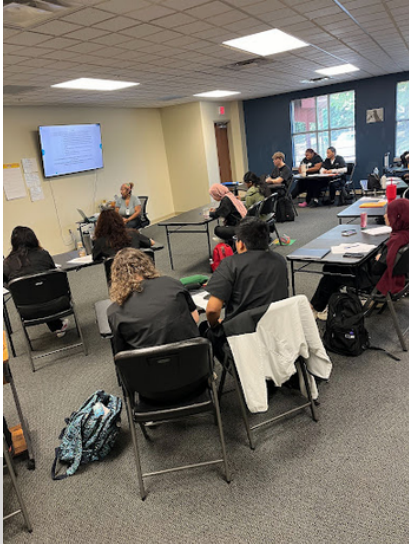
